

Earlier this Month, Kevin Wiley and Amy Nuss gathered in the sanctuary and, while keeping a safe distance, recorded some hymns for our virtual worship service. When we finished recording the hymn *Healer of our Every III*, Amy paused and said, "Wow, this song is so fitting for right now." I had previously asked them to record it so it could be played on the Sunday when our Gospel lesson tells of one of Jesus' healing stories, but hearing Amy's response gave me pause. This is the hymn we need to hear right now. Here are the Lyrics for you to ponder.

Matt's Motivational Minute



"The secret of change is to focus all of your energy, not on fighting the old, but on building the new." —Socrates

I don't know about you, but with all the changes going on around me I have often found myself fighting the old and not building the new! I have realized in some ways how futile this has been. I have spent countless hours and unknown amounts of energy trying to hold on to the past. I think I have mentioned it before, but with all of the changes with COVID and being physically isolated I have gone through the 5 stages of grief (denial, anger, bargaining, depression, and acceptance) sometimes all at once! One of the things I was reflecting on when getting ready for this newsletter is what drew me to the MDivX program with Luther Seminary. One of the biggest draws for me was to be in the first pilot program of something new and something innovative! When thinking about how I normally enjoy trying new things in ministry I wondered why I hadn't always seen the opportunity to build new things. A phrase that is repeated over and over when talking about the MDivX program is "holy experiment." This is where we the church discern what God is calling us to and invites us to try something new. It may not be a "success" and may not be something we do for the next decade, but it is where God is calling us to now in response to the situation around us. I am looking forward to partnering with Pastor Cate and you the congregation as we try some "holy experiments" this fall building on the new. I have listed below a few new ministry opportunities along with something familiar but in a new format.

- "<u>Blue Service</u>"—This is a service that is typically done in December during Advent and usually on the winter solstice which is the longest night of the year. The idea behind it is that the holiday season can be hard for those whose hearts are hurting and it is a reminder you are not alone. It is a contemplative service for those that are carrying pain or loss. One of the things we recognize is that there is a lot of grief and this service is an opportunity to sit in that grief with one another. We will be doing this on Sunday, September 27 at 7:00 PM. This is for anyone and any form of grief whether it's a loss of a loved one, loss of starting a new school, job loss, mental & physical ailments, loss of relationship, loss of hope, loss of wellness, loss of pet or whatever it may be we invite you to this service. More detailed information will be coming out in the next few weeks!
- Parent Support Group— Have you ever been on an important phone or video call and had your children fighting and screaming loud in the background? Have you felt frustrated by local parks closing? Are your kids fighting more than normal? Are you feeling anxious about school? We will be starting a Zoom meeting once a month to help each other out during this stressful time. This is a kid-free and judgment free time to join myself and other parents to talk, vent and be there for one another. We will be working with parents on the best day, date, and time to meet. More information will be coming soon!
- Confirmation—This is something familiar but in a new format. Confirmation will resume on Thursday, September 3 at 6:00 PM. For our first meeting we are planning on gathering outside together for 30 minutes with social distancing and wearing masks. Pastor Cate and I are looking forward to working with our confirmands during this time and seeing how faith fits in during difficult situations and times. We are working on what the Affirmation of Baptism will look like at the end of October.

<u>His House:</u> His House in Placentia has been meeting the needs of the hungry and homeless in Orange County through the entire time of the pandemic. Lives have been transformed:

- 20 families have received safe shelter and supportive services.
- 22 families were provided with financial assistance to prevent homelessness.
- 35% of the residents graduated and moved into permanent housing.

REACHING OUT IN OTHER WAYS: If you can't share food, money or time with others because you are "staying in" — how about the things you CAN do?

- Pray for friends, family, our leaders, and the world. Please note if you would like to pray with others, we are on Zoom at 8:30 AM each Saturday. To get the Zoom link, email Jeanette Parr at parr3@roadrunner.com. If you do not have internet access, you can also join over the phone by calling in.
- Send a short note via snail mail or email, or make a phone call and leave a message. Let others know they are cared about.
- Contact Pastor Cate about visiting others SAFELY through the Prayer Patrol.
- Think about ways to share Emanuel and your faith with others and what you will continue to do when we meet again in person.

I have found that often by reaching out to others, I feel better too. Give it a try.

TAKE IT TO THE LORD IN PRAYER






Kid's kornær

A BUSHEL OF Design a handy bag to tote your books this fall. What you need:

- Plain canvas bag
- Cardboard scrap
- Acrylic paints (2 colors)
- 2 small paper plates
- Apple
- Knife (and adult help)
- Foam brush
- Scrap paper

What you do:

- 1. Lay the bag flat on a table, and place cardboard inside for protection.
- 2. Pour a paint dollop on each plate.
- 3. Slice the apple in half, keeping the core intact.
- 4. Brush a thin layer of paint on the cut side of an apple half. Practice making stamps on scrap paper. Use the other color on the other apple half.
- 5. Paint and stamp the bag with your final design. When dry, remove the cardboard.
- 6. Use the bag for school and Sunday school. Happy reading!
