Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr




"He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber. He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep." — Psalm 121:3-4

I'm writing this newsletter article in the middle of the night. In case you were wondering, no it's not because I missed the deadline and am now pulling an all-nighter. Tonight, I just couldn't sleep. I woke up in the middle of the night and couldn't fall back asleep, the occasional bout of insomnia that strikes most of us from time to time. But after tossing and turning for awhile, I decided the best thing for me was to get up and get some work done. These emails that I've put off writing all week—done! The plans and procedures that needed tweaking—done! Write my October newsletter article—done!

Throughout this night, I have been thinking about the power of God in the nighttime. When most of the world sleeps and rests, the God of Israel neither slumbers nor sleeps. This line from Psalm 121 is one that is often read at funerals to remind us of the immutability of God. FROM THE BOARD OF PARISH EDUCATION

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

Thank you for having your kids join us for our online Sunday School lessons each week.

This past month we have learned so much about our how God's love impacts our lives and we can help share God's love.

- 1. In our lesson about "The Good Sheep Dog," we saw we are all God's sheep and Jesus is our Good Shepherd. God needs us to help Him take care of His sheep by reminding people how much God loves them.
- 2. "Jesus Appears to Seven Disciples" Bible story took place after Jesus was resurrected. This was the third time Jesus had appeared to the disciples. During 'Drive-Thru Communion' our students received a gift bag with a sticker picture for them to create their own picture of this Bible story. Please have them retell the story to your family.
- 3. In our "Can You Write with Your Mouth" lesson we discovered, "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13). We can ask God to give us strength to use our abilities when times get hard for us. He will show us the way. God gives each part of the body a job to do and each part has a special purpose. While we know this isn't "back to normal," we hope that having a short time of individual prayer, seeing church members from your car, and receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ will strengthen you for the days ahead.

CONFIRMANDS AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM OCTOBER 25 AT 5:00 PM



It's finally time for the Affirmation of Baptism! Our young people who are coming to the end of their 2-year confirmation faith formation program were not able to celebrate the Affirmation of Baptism originally planned for May. We will now be celebrating with them on Reformation Sunday, October 25. The Students will share their statements of faith as part of our recorded virtual worship service posted on our website and on social media platforms the morning of October 25. Then we plan to have the Rite of Confirmation take place live at our in-person parking lot worship that evening at 5:00 PM.

Create autumn-themed artwork using items from plants.



- Seed pods, nuts. pine cones
- Mixing bowl
- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup salt
- 1 cup warm water
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Go on a nature walk and collect seeds with interesting textures.
- 2. In the bowl, mix flour and salt. Gradually add water. On a table, knead the dough. (If too dry, add more water; if too sticky, add more flour.)
- 3. Flatten a ball of dough and stamp impressions in it with the seeds.
- 4. If desired, bake for several hours at 150 degrees until dry and hard. Or, to reuse dough, store in an airtight container up to 6 months.
