

Post It Notes from Pastor Luehr



"Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" is one of my favorite hymns, and if you don't know it just type that phrase into YouTube and a plethora of versions come up. The month of November is often a time when we offer thanksgiving for all of the blessings that have come our way. However, this year it seems that the "blessings" are few and far between, and how it's easy to think, "What do I really have to be thankful for? Where is God blessing me this year?"

I think of how, especially now when we are at a time of counting our blessings amidst a difficult year, that we often want to make God into a "good parts" version. Kind of like a highlights reel or a theatrical cut versus a director's cut of a movie. We just want the good stuff, we don't want to think of where God was during that messy divorce and custody hearing, or during that long hospital stay where the illness just never got better. We don't want to think of the bullying and teasing that was relentless. Come thou fount of every hurt, every pain, every trial, every pandemic, every divided election? I don't think so. Where is the blessing in that?

It's easy for us to congratulate a student for making the honor roll, but it's hard to ask a student about a suspension. We applaud those who get promoted, but aren't quite sure how to respond to those who are laid-off. But we're not a "good parts only" people. We are a people of good parts and bad parts. We are a people of the exciting swashbuckling parts and the long monotonous drawn-out parts. Though we often like to put on the face of being a good parts only people who worship in a good parts version church, we don't have a good parts only God. God is a God of love, a good God, an all-powerful God. A God who *can* perform miracles but consistently enters our lives through the promise. A promise He makes to us in the person of Jesus Christ, who takes on our frail humanity and dies, for all. Come thou fount of every promise. Our blessing is that we don't have a God who is only the "good parts version." Our blessing is that though we have hope for God to be there in our abundance, we have a *promise*, a promise given to us on the cross, that Christ is willing to go into the depths with us. And He does even unto death. We were never given a promise that life in Christ would be a life without pain, and 2020 has proven that ten-fold. We were given a promise though, that we would never have to be in pain alone. Come thou fount of every promise.

Of course trusting in this promise is not easy. I struggle with it again and again and again. As Christians we are called to be with each other in the good parts and the bad parts. But for me, I know it is much easier to compliment the honor roll student than it is to confront the suspended one. Come thou fount of every promise —sometimes that's too hard to ask for.

We can't always enter into others pain well. Sometimes we can't do it at all. But whether or not I follow through with answering Christ's command to love my neighbor even into their darkness, that promise is still there. When we fail, when we avoid asking the difficult questions, when we would rather look at the good parts version of someone, Jesus will still be there as He has promised, in our depths.

Better than any feast or hymn or even family, Jesus gave us a remarkable blessing. He gave us Himself. Come thou fount of every promise. Come, Lord Jesus. Come. Amen.

Being Thankful in a Thankless Season

When I was trying to figure out what I would write about, I ended up contacting a friend who is a pastor to ask them what they were going to write about. We were having a great conversation and one thing we both thought about is how we can be thankful in what is seemingly a thankless season. In a quick Google search, there were at least 25 Biblical verses that showed up right away about being thankful. I also thought of the praise song "Give thanks to the Lord, our God and King. His love endures forever." I think about how in a "normal" time it would be really easy for me to write an article to y'all about being thankful about all the blessings God has given you.

One of the things I've learned throughout seminary and the pandemic is to look outside of myself. If things are going well for me, it doesn't mean things are going well for everyone in the congregation—or vice versa—if things are bad for me it doesn't mean it's bad for everyone. But getting back to how to be thankful in a thankless season, I don't have an "easy 5 step program" to get everyone to be thankful and see all the things God has done for them. At different points in life, it doesn't feel like God has done much for you while at other times you can't go anywhere without seeing all the great things God has done.

What I would invite you to do is to try to build the muscle of gratitude. Maybe its sharing a good and bad thing from your day with someone important in your life. Maybe it's doing a journal where you reflect on your day. Whatever your practice may be, I would invite you to take baby steps to start your journey of trying to find a way to be thankful even in seemingly thankless seasons. I also pray that wherever you are in your faith journey you experience the presence of the living God.

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

Thank you for having your kids join us for our online Sunday School lessons each week.

This past month we have learned so much about our how God's love impacts our lives, that God forgives us, and how we can become strong in our faith.

- 1. In our lesson "All Clear" we saw how calculators are a great invention. When we make a mistake, we press the "all clear" button and our mistakes disappear. The Bible says that God is the one who forgives all our sins. It's like God has a "clear" button for each one of us and our sins are forgiven. When we truly ask God to forgive us, our sins are forgiven. God wipes our sins away. We can start all over again. How special is that!!!

DRIVE-THRU COMMUNION & PRAYER SERVICE NOVEMBER 1 & 15 FROM 10-11:00 AM

For the weeks leading up to Advent, we plan to alternate weekly between *Drive-Thru Communion & Prayer Service* and *Parking Lot Worship*. On Sunday, November 1 and November 15 from 10-11:00 AM (note new time) we will hold Drive-Thru Communion & Prayer Service. We invite you to drive onto campus, remain in your car and visit various stations for prayer, music, Communion and blessing. More detailed information including an instructional video can be found on our YouTube channel. The video includes the safety precautions we at the church are taking as well as those we expect of members who attend drive-thru service. This service will be held in the upper parking lot east of the Sanctuary and north of Hope Center. When you RSVP, please include the names of everyone who will be attending in your vehicle and which 15-minute time slot you will attend. We will also be collecting food donations for the CRCC and Storehouse Ministries.

Parking Lot Worship ~ November 8, & 22 at 10:00 AM

We will hold *Parking Lot Worship* (with people in chairs) on November 8 and November 22 at 10:00 AM (note new time). These will be short in-person services of music, scripture, homily and prayer. We will be practicing safety protocols. We are asking attendees to park in the lower lot by the classrooms and then walk to the registration table on the patio to check in. Then continue to the upper parking lot where an usher will direct you and assist with a chair if needed. You are welcome to bring your own chair or you may use one of the folding chairs from the church. If you would like to attend but wish to stay in your car, drive into the upper lot and an usher will direct you to a space designated for cars. Also, if you would like to sit in a chair but walking from the lower lot is a challenge, there will be limited parking in the upper lot for those in need. A taste of A history

Add a yummy, authentic touch to your Thanksgiving meal with this recipe.




What you need:

- 2/3 cup heavy cream
- pint jar with lid
- strainer
- bowl
- container
- salt



What you do:

- 1. Pour cream into the jar and close the lid tightly.
- 2. Shake vigorously about 8 minutes, until a solid lump of butter forms. (Take turns with a friend!)
- 3. Strain the contents, catching the buttermilk in a bowl to save for another recipe.
- 4. Put the butter in a container. Add salt to taste.
- 5. After chilling the butter, enjoy on fresh bread.
