



We will meet where we can physically distance and we will take all precautions including wearing masks. **Anyone who has ever wanted to reach out on behalf of Emanuel and has any ideas for this, please come!!!**

In addition to supporting our community ministries, let's consider how else we can be good friends and neighbors. Hearts reach out too! Here are some thoughts on how to become a friend and nurture a good friendship. In our world today, friendship and love for all people are the way to peace.

BE KIND. This most basic behavior emphasized during childhood remains the core of successful adult relationships. Think of friendship as an emotional bank account. Every act of kindness and every expression of gratitude are deposits into this account, while criticism and negativity draw down the account.

- **Listen up**. Ask what's going on in your friends' lives. Let the other person know you are paying close attention through eye contact, body language, and occasional brief comments such as, "That sounds fun." When friends share details of hard times or difficult experiences, be empathetic, but don't give advice unless your friends ask for it.
- **Open up.** Build intimacy with your friends by opening up about yourself. Being willing to disclose personal experiences and concerns shows that your friend holds a special place in your life and deepens your connection.
- Show that you can be trusted. Being responsible, reliable and dependable is key to forming strong friendships. Keep your engagements and arrive on time. Follow through on commitments you've made to your friends. When your friends share confidential information, keep it private.
- Make yourself available. Building a close friendship takes time—together. Make an effort to see
 new friends regularly and to check in with them in between meet-ups. You may feel awkward the
 first few times you talk on the phone or get together, but this feeling is likely to pass as you get
 more comfortable with each other.

God bless all of you for your generous Hearts and Hands reaching out to others.

Greetings to all Emanuel Youth and Parents!

Thank you for having your kids join us for our online Sunday School lessons each week. This past month we have learned so much about Jesus, the meaning of Easter, and faith.

- 1. In our lesson "Do I Have to Like Everybody?" we learned that Jesus says, "I give you a new command: Love each other as I have loved you." With God's help we can show God's love to people even if we don't like the things they do or say.
- 2. On Palm Sunday we heard the story of Jesus riding on a donkey as He entered Jerusalem for the Passover. People honored Jesus by putting palm branches and their coats on the ground for him to walk on. Jesus was the "King of Peace" and the whole world celebrated!

In-Person Outdoor Worship Every Sunday

The church council has determined it to be reasonably safe for Emanuel to resume outdoor parking lot worship on Sundays at 10:00 AM. We will follow the previous format with people seated outdoors in chairs for a short in-person service of prayer, communion, music, scripture, and homily. We will be practicing the usual safety protocols and are asking attendees to park in the lower lot by the classrooms and then walk to the registration table on the patio to check in. Then please continue to the upper parking lot where an usher will direct you and assist with a chair if needed. You are encouraged to bring your own chair or you may use one of the folding chairs from the church. If you would like to attend but wish to stay in your car, drive into the upper lot and an usher will direct you to a space designated for cars. Also, if you would like to sit in a chair but walking from the lower lot is a challenge, there will be limited parking in the upper lot available.

While we know this is still not "back to normal" we hope having a short time of worshipping together again will strengthen you for the days ahead.



JOY CIRCLE ON ZOOM TUESDAY, MAY 18 AT 9:30 AM

The Joy Circle is a women's group that meets monthly for a time of discussion and fellowship. We have met virtually for the past seven months due to the pandemic; however on Tuesday, May 18 at 9:30 AM we plan to meet **IN PERSON**. We will either meet in the hall or on the patio, wear masks, and each bring our own food. There will also be an option to participate via Zoom for anyone who prefers to attend virtually. 

Kid's Kornær




Jesus commands us to be his witnesses. This craft is a reminder to reach out to all our "circles."

What you need:

- 5 bowls or cups (assorted sizes)
- Construction paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Brad fastener
- Crayons or markers

What you do:

- Place the bowls and cups upside down, each on a different color of paper. Trace around the circles and cut them out.
- 2. With a pencil, pierce a small hole atop each circle. Layer circles on each other from largest to smallest, aligning the holes. Insert the brad through all layers.
- 3. Starting in the center, label the circles *my house, my city, my state, my country, the world.* Draw a picture on each one.
- 4. Pray, asking Jesus how you can spread his message.
