

Fall has arrived!! Well, kind of. Despite the 100 degree temperatures this week, most of us are happily enjoying a return to Fall routines and rhythms. I am especially thankful to have had so many kids in worship and Sunday School these past weeks; their energy and excitement is contagious. There's a reason Jesus not only welcomes children, but also reminds us to come into the presence of God, our Perfect Parent, like children! Such joy!

With Fall and the lowering of covid numbers, I am excited to share that beginning with Sunday, October 16, we will be inviting people who would like to do so to come forward in worship to **receive communion at the altar!** To keep everyone safe, we will be taking some extra precautions. We will still be able to stand or kneel at the altar rail. The server and I will distribute the bread (wafer) and disposable, individual cups of juice and wine wearing a glove. Please be patient and open-minded as we work out the details that will allow everyone to share in this gift of God's grace and sign of our unity in Christ comfortably AND safely.

Jesus and Nature: Teachers of Faith

Jesus often turned to the natural world in teaching, opening our eyes to see creation not just as something to be cared for, but as our teacher and kindred. It is no mistake that Jesus, who lovingly spoke of soil and plants, was thought to be a gardener that first Easter morning. This three-session Bible study will shift our perspectives and allow nature to be our teacher, through the words of Jesus and other parts of Scripture. The trees, the soil and the creatures will offer us new perspectives on the character of God and challenge us to deepen our stewardship of God's precious creation. Our study uses the Bible study offered in Gather Magazine, the ELCA magazine for women.

October 17 "Soil"

Dig deeply into the parable of the soil (Matthew 13) and other Biblical accounts that relate to care for this part of creation, while looking at models of growth that involve wholeness and wellness.

November 21 "Creatures"

Observe and learn about God from birds, foxes, sheep, dogs and other animals, while considering habitat protection, food justice and the model of trust.






Create some invisible art and then reveal the seasonal design.
