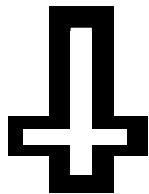

A NOTE FROM THE

PASTORAL INTERN



February Newsletter

Peace and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you and your spirit!

As we approach the season of Lent, we are invited to pause and reflect on the truth that “every good and perfect gift is from above” (James 1:17). Lent offers us space to notice God’s generosity in our lives and to consider how we receive and respond to those gifts.

This season, we will be doing that reflection through discovering what stewardship means to each of us as individuals and as a community of followers of Christ. I know that word can be triggering for some, so I ask you to stay with me for a moment. Stewardship is about far more than the church asking for more. Webster defines stewardship as “the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one’s care.”

At its heart, stewardship is an invitation to reflect on where our gifts of time, treasure and talents are being used. I would even expand this understanding of stewardship to include all of God’s beloved children: our relationships, our mental and emotional well-being, our energy, and the ways we care for ourselves and one another. This season is an invitation to notice, to tend, and to trust that God is at work, even in the quiet work of reflection. Much like Lent itself, stewardship is a season of reflection that ultimately leads us toward resurrection and renewed life.

As we move forward into Lent, I keep coming back to Jesus’ image of the gardener who chooses to stay and tend the soil. (Luke 13:6-9) Not rushing the process. Not giving up when fruit is slow to appear. For us at Emanuel, this feels like a shared invitation to continue tending what God has entrusted to us as a community. To care for the soil of our lives, our relationships, and our ministry with patience and honesty, trusting that God is already at work beneath the surface. We may not yet see the fruit of this season, but we move ahead together in hope, grounded in the promise that God’s careful, faithful tending leads toward new life.

May this Lent bless us with the courage to tend gently, the trust to wait, and the hope to believe that resurrection is still growing among us.

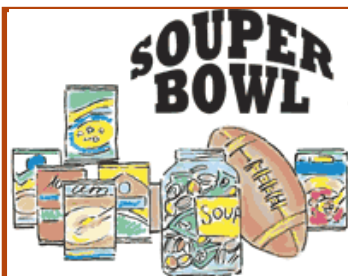
FEBRUARY 2026 HAHO OUTREACH

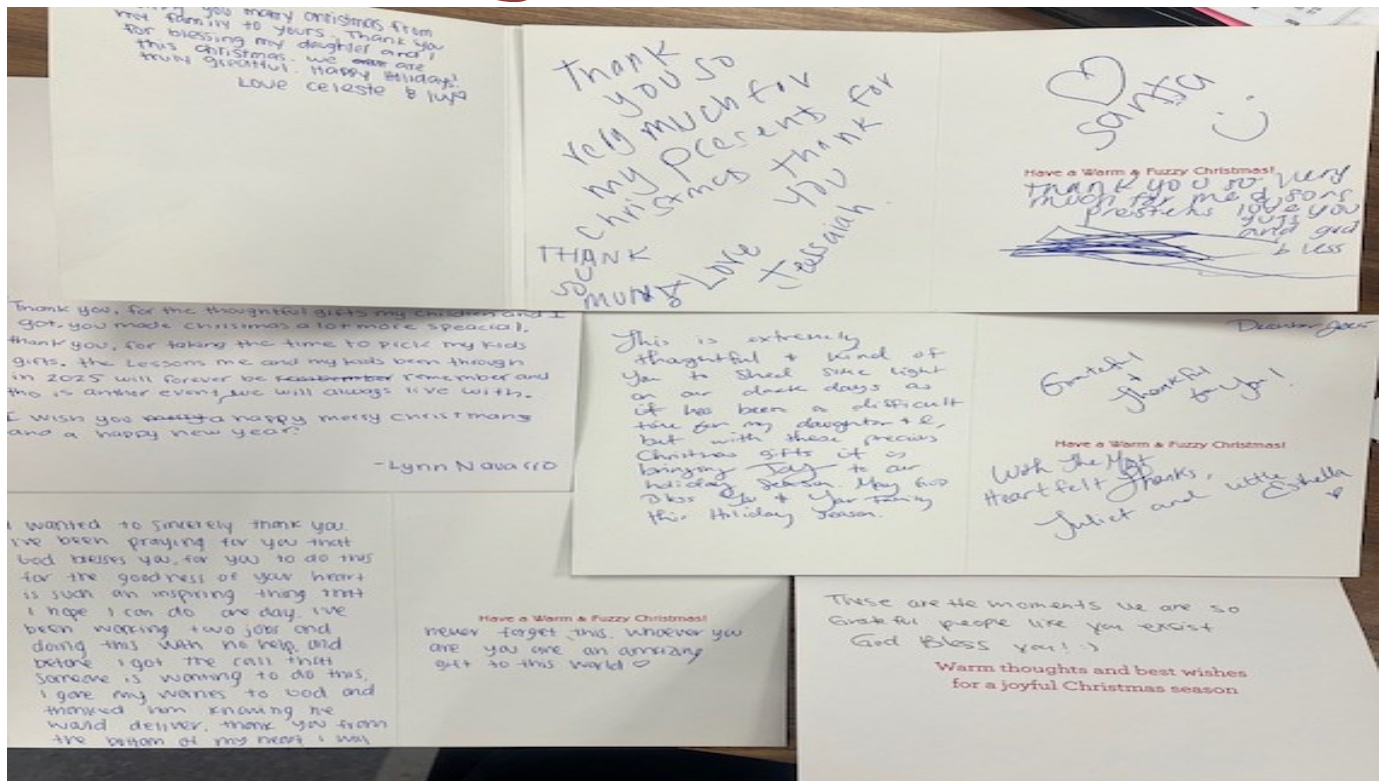

This project is being coordinated through HAHO. If you have questions, please call Sharon or Jeanette.

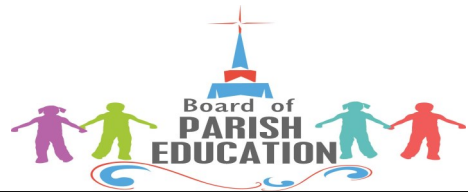


~St Jude Clothes Closet~

February, 2026-From the Board of Parish Education Sunday School meets each Sunday at 11:00 AM in Moerer Hall!

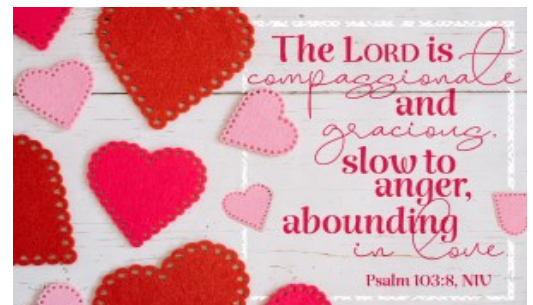
Sunday School: Sunday School is held weekly for Preschool through 8th grade. Visitors are always welcome! With the Whirl Sunday School program, we learned that we are chosen as God's Children and we can be a light to the Nations with Christ. We are now in the season of Epiphany where Jesus is announced as the Lamb of God, and we are united in Christ. Our weekly Whirl videos bring our lessons alive to our everyday challenges that kids face.

Offerings: Our students would like their weekly offerings to go to the Emanuel Good Samaritan Fund where it helps meet the needs of members and people. Many people have been helped by this support. In the past, we have used our offerings for animal care at the Humane Society, helping the Ocean Habitat, aiding fire victims from the L.A. Fires and now want to reach out to people who need support. Please help and encourage your child to participate in giving to our weekly Sunday School offerings. They took such pride in buying gifts for kids from the Angel Tree.

Game Day: A Game Day is in the planning stages! Watch for details. This will be a time for a variety of games and activities for youth to take part in. Our older youth will be given the opportunity to plan a game to introduce to the group. This will involve lots of time to run and be physically active and even some quiet games too. A six-minute message will be given at our closing. These messages may present questions to the kids such as "How did God Get All the Stars in the Right Places?" or "Did Jesus Get Into Trouble When He Was a Kid?" These messages can teach important spiritual truths in ways kids understand. This will be a special time for our kids to be together and grow in faith.

Study Buddies: Study Buddies is off to a great start in 2026! Our students arrived with smiles on their faces eager to work on their homework and see everyone again. They look forward to the snacks and going to the prize box each time they come. We meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00-4:30 PM for children in grades 1-6. This program is open to all children in our surrounding neighborhood as well as our Emanuel Lutheran family. 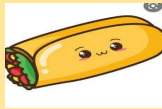



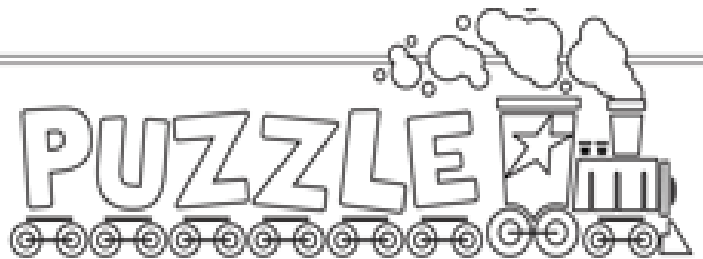
